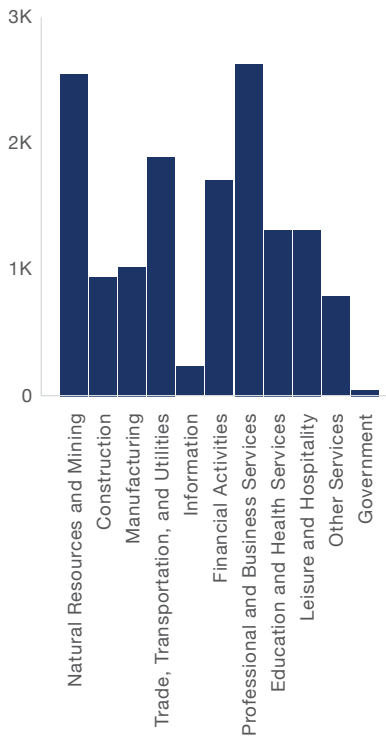

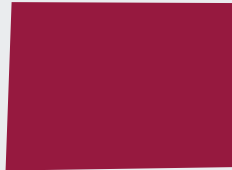

2,316

workers in Colorado.

On average, they earned

\$71,216

in annual income.

By comparison, the average worker in the U.S. earned approximately \$55,400

were sustained as employees spent their wages on consumer goods.

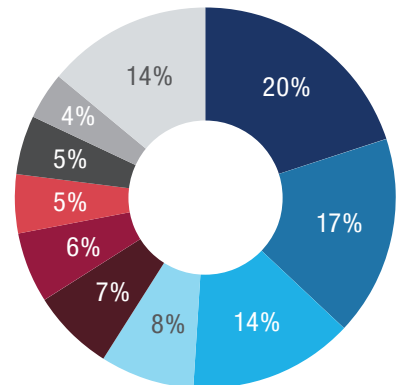

This was made up of \$285 million in federal taxes and \$160 million in state and local taxes.

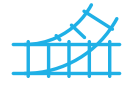
