

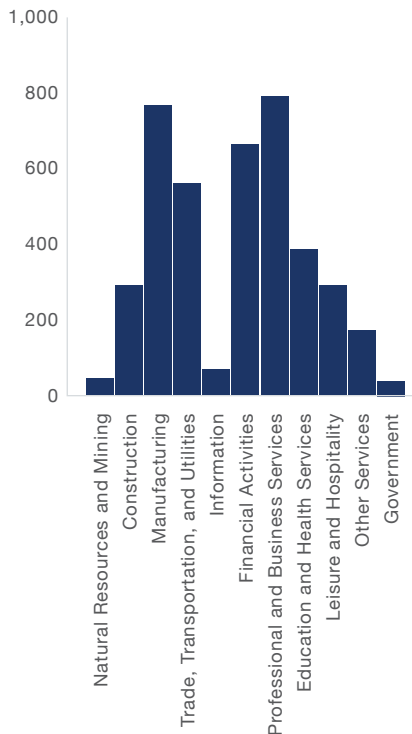

# 1,471 indirect jobs

supported through railway suppliers' supply-chain purchases.

# 1,976 induced jobs

were sustained as employees spent their wages on consumer goods.

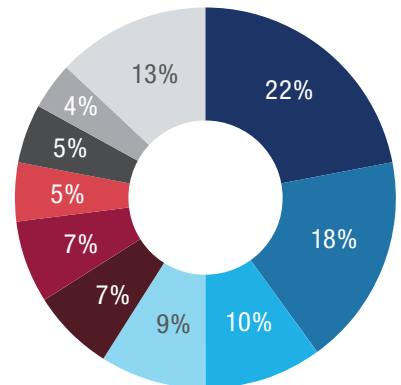
