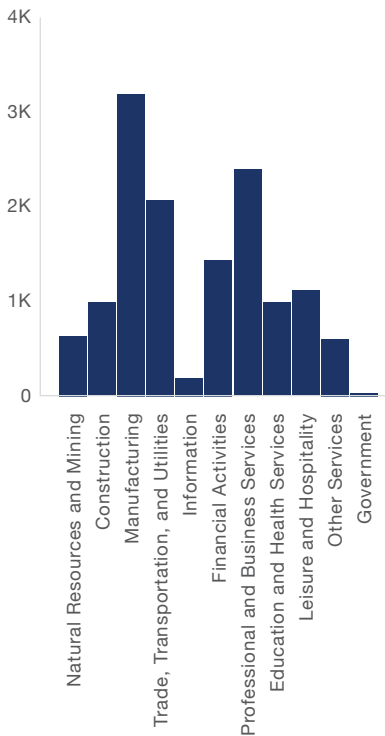

CONTRIBUTION TO NORTH CAROLINA'S GDP IN 2017



\$1.3 billion

In 2017, the railway supply industry directly employed

3,114

workers in North Carolina.

On average, they earned

\$67,179

in annual income.

By comparison, the average worker in the U.S. earned approximately \$55,400

5,101 indirect jobs

supported through railway suppliers' supply-chain purchases.

5,414 induced jobs

were sustained as employees spent their wages on consumer goods.

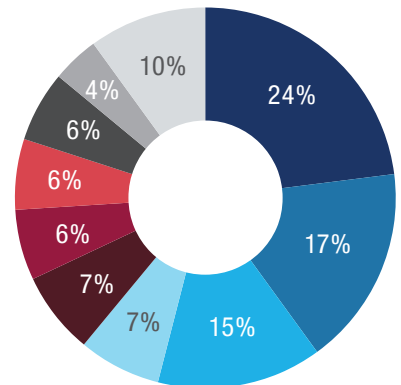

This was made up of \$199 million in federal taxes and \$85 million in state and local taxes.

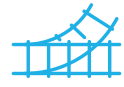
OCCUPATION PROFILE OF RAILWAY SUPPLIERS IN NORTH CAROLINA
