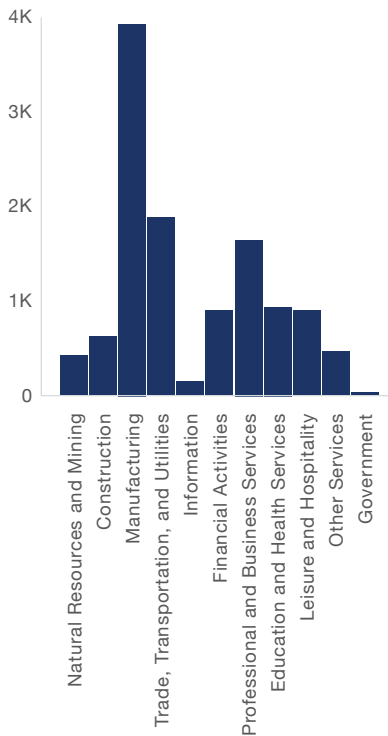

were sustained as employees spent their wages on consumer goods.

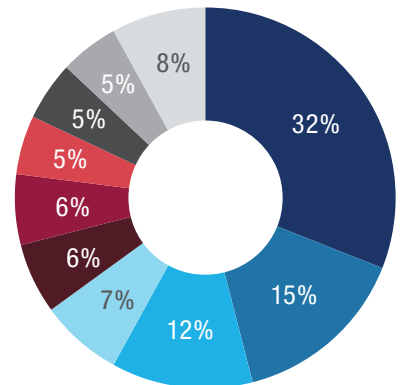
