

Eligibility Requirements

NOTE: Current high school students are NOT eligible to apply. This includes those that will graduate in 2019.

1. The parent of the applicant must be currently employed by an entity that is a member in good standing of the Railway Supply Institute (RSI) or an individual member in good standing of one of the organizations listed below:
 - Air Brake Association (ABA)
 - International Association of Railway Operating Officers (IAROO)
 - League of Railway Women (LRW)
 - Locomotive Maintenance Officers Association (LMOA)
 - Railcar Technical Services Association (RTSA, formerly MARTS)

2. The applicant must be a child of a current employee and:
 - must be the employee's biological / step-child OR in legal custody of the employee (as deemed by a court),
 - must be attending the accredited institution on a full-time basis in a program of study that will lead to an Associates or Bachelors Degree (applicants from outside the U.S. should be enrolled in a curriculum which has comparable accreditation)
 - must be attending an accredited institution (one eligible to receive federal funds) for the fall 2019 semester (funds cannot be deferred to another academic year),
 - must expect to achieve at least Sophomore Status (30+ credit hours) by the start of the fall 2019 term
 - must be under the age of 24 as of 1/1/2019,
 - must NOT be a currently enrolled in high school,
 - must NOT be a recipient of the previous year's RSI scholarship.

Amount of Award

A minimum of five scholarships up to an amount of \$5,000 each will be given to scholarship recipients. Depending on the number of scholarship donations, additional scholarships may be given at lesser amounts. The funds will be prorated over the academic year following the application deadline with subsequent payments at the beginning of each term during the balance of the school year. Distribution of funds will be administered by Spaulding Admin Services and disbursed to the suitable official of each recipient's institution. The Railway Supply Institute, Inc. reserves the right to not distribute funding for any category in which there are no suitable applicants.

International Applicants: Students applying from outside of the United States *and* attending an accredited university outside of the U.S. will be judged along with other international applicants for one scholarship. *Note: Parent company must be willing to facilitate payment to international institution if deemed necessary by RSI or applicant will not be able to receive awarded funds.*

Application Process

To apply for the RSI Scholarship, materials listed below must be sent to the RSI Scholarship Coordinator along with the scholarship application. Mail materials to: Mila Spaulding, Spaulding Admin Services, Attn: RSI Scholarship, 18563 Willoughby Heights Lane, Rockville, VA 23146.

A completed application will consist of:

1. A completed 2019/2020 RSI scholarship application form.
2. A professional resume that contains work experience, education information, community service, involvement in organizations, and any other information the applicant feels appropriate.
3. A certified college transcript from the school or schools attended which includes college level work completed through December 31, 2018 plus courses in which currently enrolled to verify the applicant's full-time student status (at least 12 hours per semester). Transcripts printed from a website are not admissible.
4. An essay not exceeding four hundred words. The essay questions are listed below.
 - **For United States Applicants:** Imagine that you were hired to develop a campaign to raise the profile of the rail supplier industry and related manufacturing jobs in the United States. The target audiences would be media, government and business officials, and the American public. Why is the U.S. railway supply industry important to our local and national economy? What platforms and slogans would you use in this campaign to develop your messaging? As an additional reference, please see the Rail Supply Economic Impact Study at www.rsiweb.org/eis.
 - **For Non-United States Applicants:** *Describe why you have chosen your area of study and your future career and service goals. Note: Applicants may respond to the essay question in their primary language if they are not comfortable with English.*
5. A letter of recommendation from a faculty member at the school in which the applicant is currently enrolled or an employee of a Railway Supply Institute member company or affiliate group (ABA, IAROO, LMOA, LRW, RSTA) other than the applicant's parent/guardian. The letter must be written on company/school letterhead.

Scholarship Application Deadline – June 14, 2019

Evaluation and Notification

- Criteria for selection and award of scholarships will be based on the following:
Academic Achievement (50%) / Essay (30%) / Citizenship & Letter of Recommendation (20%)
- The RSI Scholarship Committee, in conjunction with Spaulding Admin Services, will base its award on the materials submitted and a telephone interview if needed. Scholarship recipients will be informed no later than July 2019 with distribution of funds to begin at the start of the fall 2019 term. The 2019/2020 scholarship monies cannot be deferred to another academic year.
