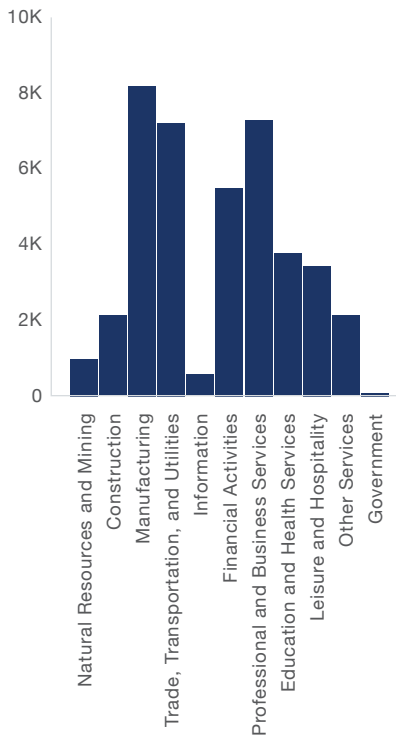

were sustained as employees spent their wages on consumer goods.

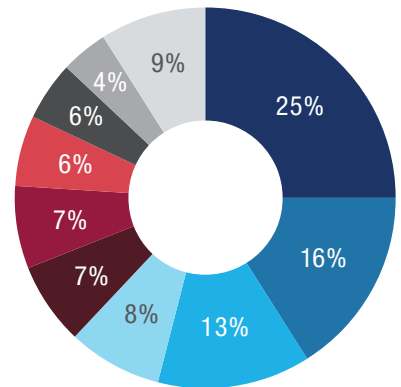

This was made up of \$774 million in federal taxes and \$367 million in state and local taxes.

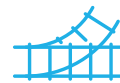
OCCUPATION PROFILE OF RAILWAY SUPPLIERS IN ILLINOIS
