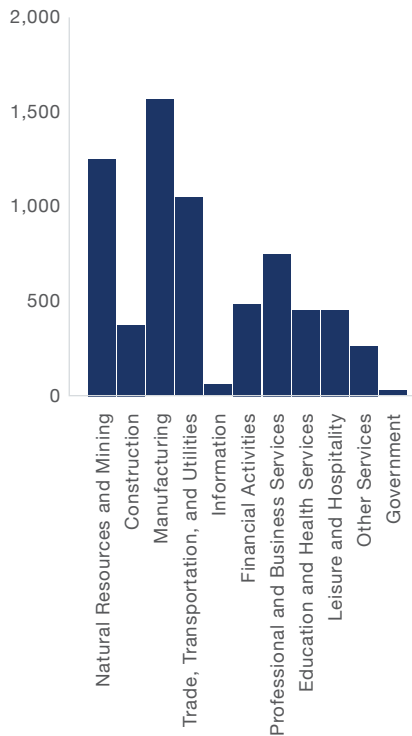

In 2017, the railway supply industry directly employed

1,375

workers in Mississippi.

On average, they earned

\$63,650

in annual income.

By comparison, the average worker in the U.S. earned approximately \$55,400

3,209 indirect jobs supported through railway suppliers' supply-chain purchases.

2,254 induced jobs were sustained as employees spent their wages on consumer goods.

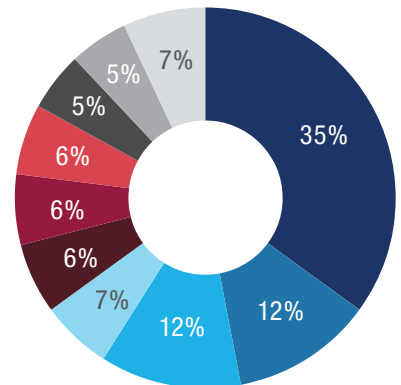

This was made up of \$87 million in federal taxes and \$57 million in state and local taxes.

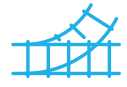
OCCUPATION PROFILE OF RAILWAY SUPPLIERS IN MISSISSIPPI
